Wear a pair of jeans long enough and eventually you'll wear them out. Thankfully, this tiny outfit in midtown Manhattan can solve just about any jeans catastrophe, from crotch holes to blown-out knees. And unlike other repair services, it also offers denim alterations, including hemming, tapering legs, and letting out waists. Just complete an online form detailing what work you need done and ship your jeans over. A week later you'll have them back, with a guarantee on every repair. Try getting your tailor to match that. *Hole in the crotch: \$35 and up; tear at the knee: \$25 and up; broken zipper: \$25; torn belt loop: \$15 and up; denimsurgeon.com*
